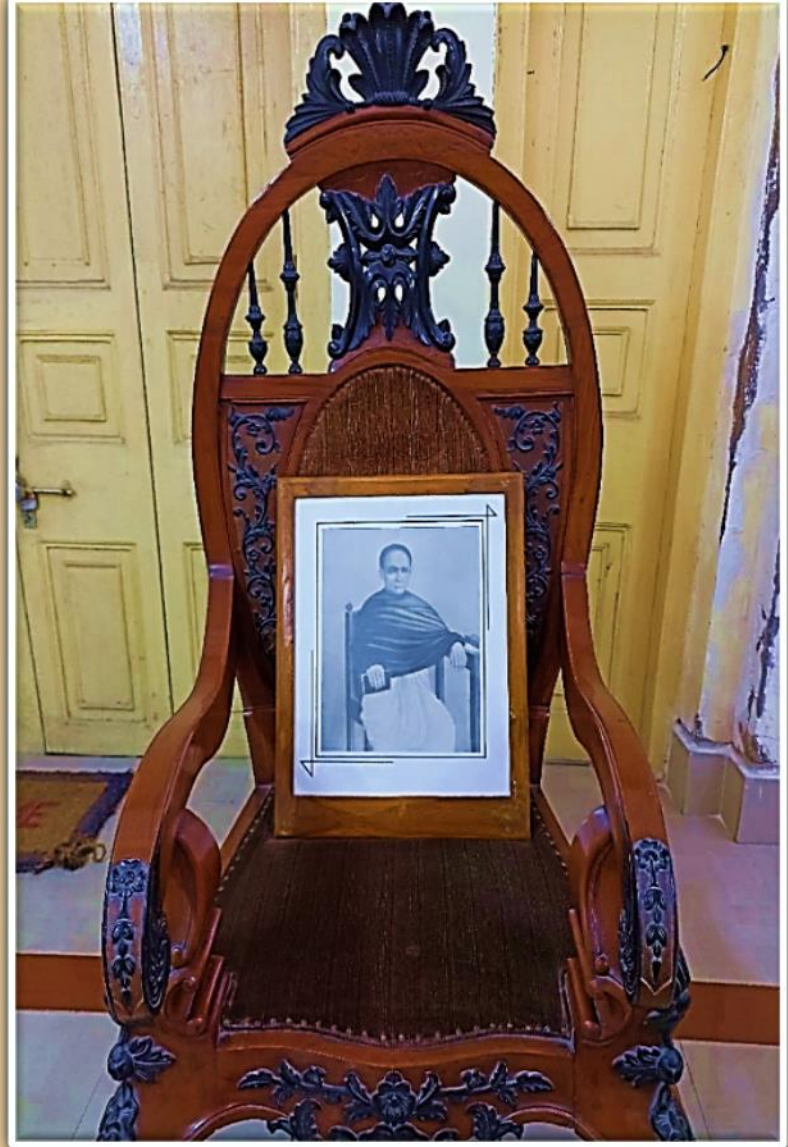
## About the Sanskrit College and University

On the 1<sup>st</sup> of January, 1824, Sanskrit College, Calcutta, started its journey as one of the premier institutions of oriental learning in colonial India. The present building was inaugurated on the 25<sup>th</sup> of February 1824.

Pandit Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar became the Principal of the Sanskrit College in 1851 and was largely responsible for restructuring and modernizing the institution and making it more inclusive. The institution has an illustrious history under several renowned scholars such as E.B. Cowell, Prasanna Kumar Sarbadhikary, Mahesh Chandra Nyayratna, Haraprasad Shastri, Surendranath Dasgupta, Gourinath Shastri, and Tarashankar Bhattacharya.

During the tenure of Gourinath Shastri the college started teaching several new, modern disciplines. The transformation of The Sanskrit College into the present Sanskrit College and University was done by the Government of West Bengal vide the Legislative Act XXXIII of 2015 and it became functional on 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2016. The present administration, the Honorable

Vice Chancellor, and the faculty members of the university are dedicated to grooming individuals capable of critical thinking and empathetic understanding of the society.



## General Guidelines for Admission

1. It is hereby notified that Admission to Post Graduate (PG) course in Sanskrit, Bengali, English, Philosophy, Ancient Indian & World History, Linguistics, Pali, and Advaita Vedanta / Panini Vyakarana / Sahitya under Traditional Oriental Learning [TOL] in The Sanskrit College and University, Kolkata for the Academic Session 2024-25 will take place according to the Regulations of the University & as per guidelines of the Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal.
2. Application will have to be filled in online, by logging on to the University website: [www.sanskritcollegeanduniversity.ac.in](http://www.sanskritcollegeanduniversity.ac.in)



2.1 Application Forms need not be submitted physically at the University Office. Admission will be strictly in the online mode. Physical Presence of any candidate will not be entertained before or during the admission process.

### 3. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

3.1 The eligibility criteria for admission to PG courses in (M.A) different subjects are given below:

5.	Two Years (Four Semesters) M.A in Ancient Indian and World History	50% & above marks or equivalent CGPA with Honours in Ancient Indian and World History/History/any related discipline from any recognized University
6.	Two Years (Four Semesters) M.A in Linguistics	45% & above marks or equivalent CGPA with Honours in Linguistics/Bengali/English/Hindi/History/Pali/Philosophy/Political Science/Sanskrit/Sociology from any recognized University
7.	Two Years (Four Semesters) M.A in Pali	45% & above marks or equivalent CGPA with Honours in any discipline from any recognized University
8.	Two years (Four Semesters) Acharya in Advaita Vedanta/Panini Vyakarana/Sahitya Under Traditional Oriental Learning ( TOL )	45 % & above marks in Honours in Sanskrit/ Shastri Degree in UG from any recognized University

- 3.2(a) Reservations for SC / ST / OBC-A / OBC-B / PH/EWS candidates shall be applicable as per Government rules, directives, and constitutional provisions.
- (b) For candidates belonging to the SC and ST categories there will be, as mandated by the Government, a relaxation of the minimum eligibility criteria (cut-off percentage) by 10%. (Provided the candidate should achieve the qualifying marks in their respective Honours subjects).
- 3.3 Candidates who have graduated with required criteria in 2023 (previous year) and 2024 (current year) are eligible to apply for PG admission in all departments. Candidates who have graduated with required criteria in any year not earlier than 2020 can apply for PG admission in Pali and the subjects under TOL system.
- 3.4 Candidate should enter the marks obtained only in the HONOURS/CORE COURSE (IN CASE OF CBCS) SUBJECT.
- 3.5 Merit List will be prepared on the basis of marks obtained at graduation and the eligibility criteria prescribed at point 3.1.
- 3.6 After Publication of Merit List/s, the eligible candidates will have to deposit required admission fees online within applicable cut-off date. After successful payment, the candidate will be notified about the confirmation of his/her admission through Email/Download option at website.
- 3.7 Sports Quota relaxation of 5% would be available to Sportspersons who have participated at State Level and above competitions/events (Certificate issued by State/Central Government shall be required).

5. The ratio for Home University Students and other University students shall be 90:10. However, the unfilled Home University seats, if any, will be filled up by the outside University students and vice-versa.

5.1 SC/ST candidates should submit SC/ST certificate issued as per the West Bengal Govt. SC/ST (identification) Act 1994. Candidates from other Universities outside West Bengal will have to submit domicile certificate along with their S.C./ S.T./ O.B.C. - A & B certificate.

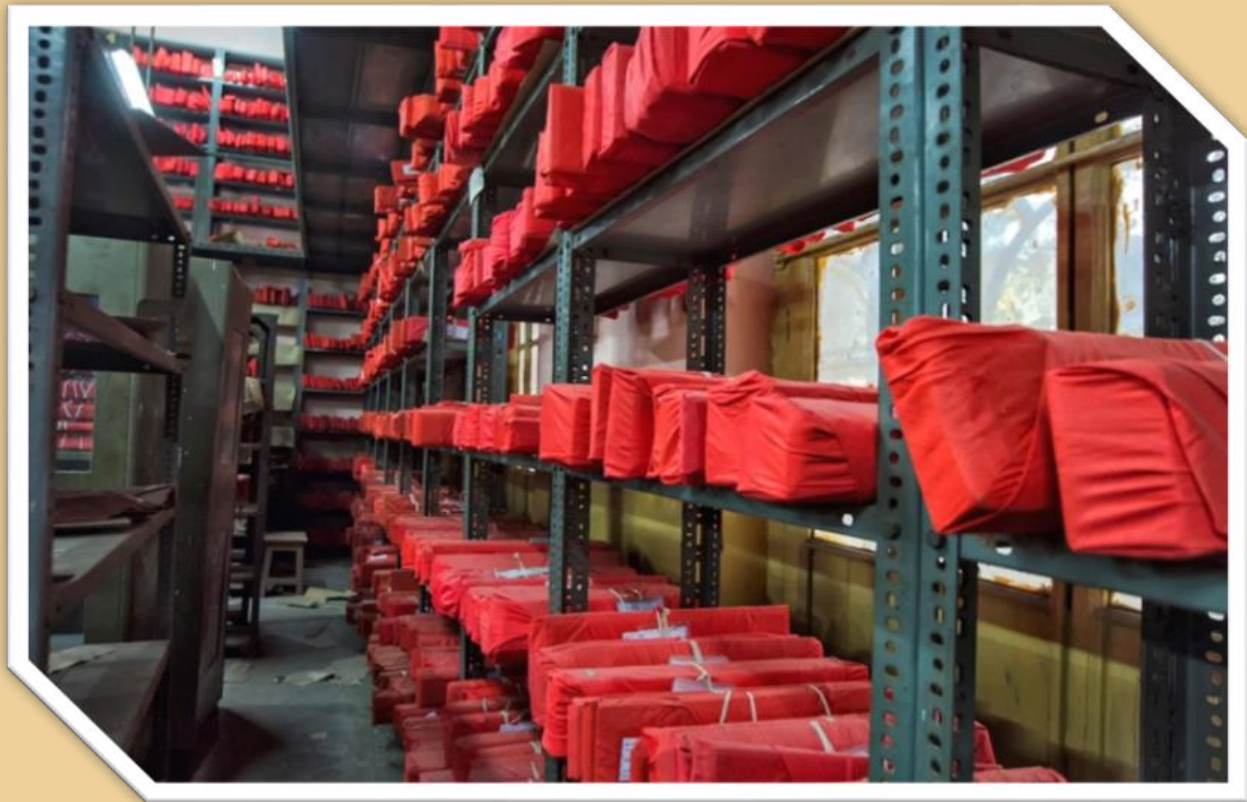
5.2 For Persons with Disability: Reservation of seats for PH candidates within each respective category (SC, ST, OBC-A, OBC- B, EWS, & unreserved) of the concerned subject shall be as per Government applicable rules.

N.B. - Persons with disability candidates having degree of 40% and above should submit a certificate issued by the competent authority of a Government Hospital.

5.3 Candidates applying for General (EWS) reservation have to submit a family income certificate issued by competent authority as per Government rules.

5.4 Candidates applying for sportspersons' relaxation have to furnish a certificate issued by any State Government or the Government of India.

5.5 After selection for admission, the candidate shall, within the date fixed by the University, deposit the necessary fees prescribed for admission. If the candidate fails to deposit the fees within the stipulated time, his/ her selection shall be liable for cancellation. Such a candidate shall not be admitted to the course unless specific order for admission is made or an extension of the date of payment is granted by the appropriate authority.





## 6. INSTRUCTIONS FOR ONLINE APPLICATION:

i. Before proceeding for filling in the Online Application Form, the applicant is required to have the following:

- Personal Email ID of the applicant is required for validations and future correspondence. In case the candidate provides wrong/incorrect email ID then he/ she will not be able to receive the updates.
- Personal Mobile Number of the applicant is required for validations and future correspondence. In case the candidate provides wrong/incorrect mobile phone number, he/ she will not be able to receive the updates.
- Clearly scanned latest Passport Size Photograph (3.5cms x 4.5cms) & Signature; all in jpeg/ jpg format, size limited to 100 KB each.



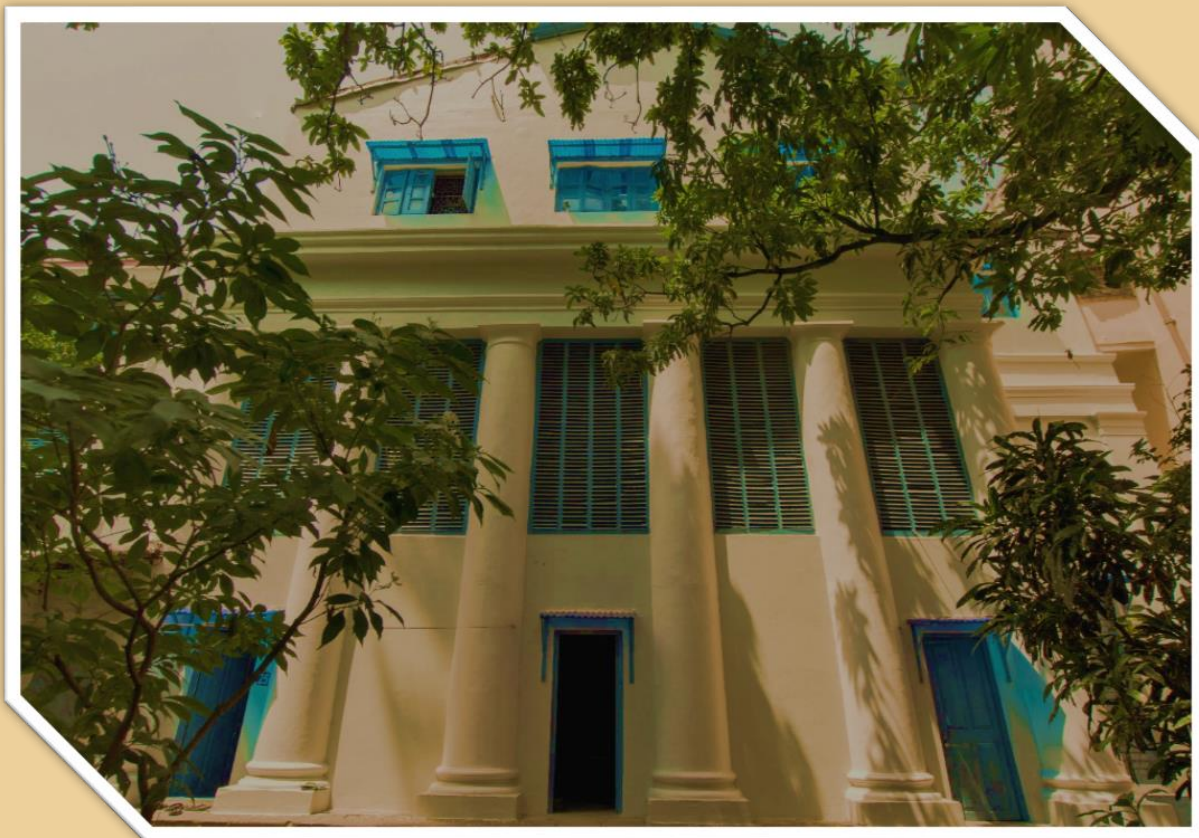
ii. The candidate will click on the **“APPLY NOW FOR NEW APPLICANT ”** link for the Application Procedure.

## 8. ADMISSION FEES:

Online Student Admission Fee for Post Graduate admission is fixed at Rs. 6,450/- (for General/EWS category students) and Rs. 6,000/- (for SC / ST / OBC-A / OBC-B / PH / BPL category students) for the Academic Session 2024-25. Relaxation of fees for the above reserved categories will be allowed subject to submission of proper certificate issued by the competent authority. (As per Govt. rules)


## **9. Course of Study**

- i. A candidate admitted to Post Graduate (Master in Arts / Acharya) Degree course shall register himself / herself as a full-time student of The Sanskrit College and University.
- ii. All Post Graduate (Master in Arts / Acharya) Degree courses will follow the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS).
- iii. A student registered for Post Graduate (Master in Arts / Acharya) Degree course in a particular subject may not be permitted to seek admission and pursue concurrently to any other equivalent or higher degree course in this university or elsewhere.
- iv. A student shall be deemed to have pursued a regular course of study in a subject provided he / she has an attendance of at least 75 per cent. Taking part in field trips/ educational tours, undertaking projects, presenting seminars, writing dissertations, appearing for VIVA etc. will be treated mandatory in calculation of the said percentage. A student will only be allowed to write the end-semester examination if his/her total attendance percentage for that semester is 75% and above.
- v. The attendance of a candidate shall be counted from the date on which the respective classes begin (to be notified by the respective departments), or from the date on which he/ she is admitted, whichever is later.
- vi. A candidate with attendance between 60% and 74.99% will be declared Non-

collegiate. Such a candidate may be permitted to write his/her end semester examination after being allowed by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Head of the Department in writing and after having paid the appropriate Non-collegiate fees.

- vii. The University shall have the power to condone a deficiency in attendance, as per the instructions given by the competent authorities.
- viii. A student debarred from writing the end-semester examination due to insufficient attendance may be allowed to take re-admission for the same semester only in the next year.
- ix. If a student becomes unsuccessful in any end-semester Examination, he/she may continue with his/her study in next semester and may appear in the term-end examination with the next batch (as per odd/ even semester schedule).
- x. The syllabus as presented along with the Regulation shall be changed, if so required, by the University from time to time.

# Some Unique Courses of Study at The Sanskrit College and University

## **Traditional Oriental Learning (TOL)**

*From the inception of this institution, Traditional Oriental Learning (TOL) was the basic wing of the then Government Sanskrit College. Now the Govt. Sanskrit College has been conferred the status of a University, keeping intact the glorious legacy of the past. There are now three Departments under the Traditional Oriental Learning (TOL) system in this university.*

*At present, Advaita-Vedānta, Pāṇini-Uyākarāṇa, and Sāhitya are the three departments under this system. Each department offers the Shastri (B.A. Honours) and Acharya (M.A.) courses in their system under the CBCS. There is a scope of learning classical texts and the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) which will guide the course of research in the fields of these specialized subjects. Further, this learning system will enhance the capability to cope with the versatile career opportunities in the field of Sanskrit as well as Indological Studies.*



## Linguistics

*This multilingual world is enriched with more than 7000 spoken and written languages. Linguistics, a science of language, deals with different structural levels of language by focusing on the core areas like phonetics, phonology, morphology and syntax. It covers several sub-branches like historical linguistics, grammatical tradition of the country, sociolinguistics, psycholinguistics, neurolinguistics, clinical linguistics, cognitive linguistics, mathematical linguistics, and field linguistics, evolution of human language, linguistic anthropology, behavioral linguistics, geolinguistics, bio-linguistics & so on. Pragmatics, discourse analysis, stylistics etc., language teaching & learning, computational linguistics, corpus linguistics, language modelling/ speech recognition etc. have immense potential in the fields of employment and research.*

*The successful students after completing their UG and PG courses in linguistics may have opportunities for various jobs within the country and abroad specially as University and College faculty, language teachers and researchers, in different government sectors dealing with the languages, in technological institutes dealing with the natural language and human cognition, in various projects related to languages and speech, like transcription, translation, speech and language annotations, ASR, NLP, NLG, OCR, artificial intelligence, robotics, as content developer, content writer, forensic linguist, manuscriptologist, archiving, digital humanities, proof reader, lexicographer, interpreter, psycholinguist, clinical linguist, speech therapist and other private sectors etc.*

*Linguistics as a flourishing young discipline provides opportunity for Ph D & Post Doctoral studies in any part of the globe.*



## **Ancient Indian and World History**

*Ancient Indian and World History (AIWH) has been taught as an important subject at the Sanskrit College and University almost since its inception.*

*At present Ancient Indian and World History (AIWH) and its syllabus have been made contemporary and updated. The name of the subject is Ancient Indian and World History (AIWH) instead of just 'History' as it includes archaeology, anthropology, history of Indian art and architecture, epigraphy, museum study etc. Learning this subject with the above-mentioned courses will help students to get direct knowledge of primary sources of history as well as gain special knowledge about ancient India. Not only that, keeping in mind the needs of the present age, the course has been arranged to suit the requirements of NEET/SET and other competitive exams. The employment opportunities in this field are myriad: ranging from teaching jobs in schools, colleges and universities, in digital learning, governmental and private sector, in museums and research institutes, as well as in journalism, content development and technical writing.*
